CONSTITUTION OF

Separated Unjustly Guarded Under Dictates - SUGUD

ARTICLE 1: NAME

The name of the association shall be **SUGUD – Separated Unjustly Guarded Under Dictates**.

ARTICLE 2: LEGAL FORM

SUGUD is established as an Unincorporated Association governed by this constitution. It is a non-profit, non-commercial, voluntary entity founded in Ireland.

ARTICLE 3: OBJECTIVES

The association pursues the following aims:

1. To defend and promote the rights of children separated unjustly from their families.
2. To provide support and advocacy for affected parents and siblings.
3. To document institutional and systemic violations of family unity and parental rights.
4. To raise public awareness on issues of enforced separation and family justice.
5. To engage with international human rights bodies and NGOs.
6. To publish reports and legal analyses on family rights violations.
7. To coordinate with legal professionals to support strategic litigation.
8. To empower affected families with psychological and legal resources.

ARTICLE 4: MEMBERSHIP

1. Membership is open to individuals who support the aims of the association.
2. New members may be admitted at the discretion of the Founder.
3. Membership may be revoked by the Founder if a member acts against the association's principles.

ARTICLE 5: GOVERNANCE

1. The governing authority of the association is vested in the Founder until a broader board is constituted.
2. The Founder shall act as Director and legal representative.



3. The Founder shall oversee all administrative, financial, and operational matters.
4. Additional roles may be created and filled as needed by the Founder.

ARTICLE 6: POWERS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The association may:

1. Represent victims of family separation before national and international institutions.
2. Submit reports, legal opinions, and public statements.
3. Collaborate with other NGOs, journalists, and legal experts.
4. Organize campaigns, conferences, and public events.
5. Advocate for legislative reforms in family and child protection law.
6. Issue periodic bulletins and public education materials.

ARTICLE 7: FINANCE

1. The association operates on a non-profit basis.
2. It may receive donations, grants, and voluntary contributions from individuals or institutions.
3. No profit shall be distributed to members or the Founder.
4. All funds shall be used solely to achieve the aims of the association.
5. Financial records shall be maintained and made available upon request to stakeholders or donors.

ARTICLE 8: HEAD OFFICE

The association's principal office shall be in Longford, Ireland, or such other address as designated by the Founder.

ARTICLE 9: LIABILITY

The association shall not be held liable for personal actions of its members or volunteers unless such actions are officially authorized.

ARTICLE 10: DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution, any remaining assets shall be transferred to another organization with similar aims, as determined by the Founder.

ARTICLE 11: DECLARATION OF ESTABLISHMENT

This Constitution was adopted by the Founder on **14 May 2025** and shall serve as the foundational document of the association.
